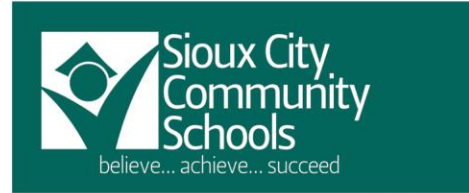


Look at the numbers as a story to forecast the future. What savings or investment choices will you make to create financial solvency?



Pathway Description:

Students learn about budgeting, money management skills, and using financial resources appropriately.

- Identify the level of risk involved with investment options

- Identify different types of insurance and the appropriate need for each
